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On-site Assessment

The audit of the plantation was conducted according to the MS 2530-3:2013 Part 3 General Principles For Oil Palm Plantations And Organized Smallholders.

The methodology for objective evidence collection was through documentation review, monitoring data and site assessment. The audit evidence obtained was based on a sample of the information; thereby introducing an element of uncertainty. Checklists and questionnaires were used to guide the collection of information. The comments made by external stakeholders were taken into account in the assessment.

Non-conformance:

On the basis of the desk review, evidences presented during the audits, non-conformance (NC) Major, Minor and Observation may be raised during the audit.

Major non-conformance shall be addressed and responded within 90 days from closing date of audit. For minor non-conformance, an action plan need to be submitted within 30 days from closing date of audit for review and acceptance. Implementation of Minor NC will be reviewed and verified during the next audit.


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


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Location Map of the Production Unit

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4. AUDIT ASSESSMENT

4.1 Surveillance Audit

The objective of the audit is to assess the activities of the plantation are in compliance with MS 2530-3:2013 Part 3 General Principles For Oil Palm Plantations And Organized Smallholders.

4.1.1 Surveillance 3

The Surveillance 3 audit was conducted on 25th March 2024.

During the **Surveillance 3** audit, there were **0 Major, 2 Minor and 1 OFI findings** being raised. The non-conformances raised during the audit were closed out by means of documents review that were established, revised and implemented appropriately and preventive actions taken by the estate.

During this audit, the minor non-compliance raised in the previous annual surveillance audit has been reviewed by the audit team by means of inspection of estate activities, conducted interviews, reviewed and verified documents that were established, corrected and implemented appropriately by the estate team. The corrective measures implemented were verified as appropriate.

For details of the assessment, refer to the summary of assessment for each indicator in section 4.4 of this report.

4.2 Stakeholders' Consultation

Nesus Certification Sdn Bhd, has notified the stakeholder as to accommodate stakeholder's consultation and communication for **Amfield Plantation Sdn Bhd** to provide comments. As at audit date on **25**th **March 2024**, there were no adverse comments received.

<u>Employees safety and health</u> Amfield Plantation Sdn Bhd has established an Occupational Safety and Health Policy signed by the managing director on 03rd August 2020. The policy is posted in the Estate Quarters.

All operation risk were assessed and documented in the HIRARC Form. The risk assessment has been updated on 10th March 2023 to include the risk of Covid-19 pandemic and to be reviewed on 10th March 2025.

Safety training for employees with introduction to MSPO and safety & health briefing on 13th February 2024.

According to the PPE issuance records, it was noted that workers were adequately outfitted with PPE. The management provided them with the necessary personal protective equipment (PPE), and replace broken or unfit PPE for free if the old or broken PPE is returned.

Amfield Plantation has a Safe Operating Procedure for handling of chemicals to ensure proper and safe handling and storage in accordance to OSH (Classification Packaging and Labeling) Regulation 1997 and OSH (Use and Standard of Exposure of Chemical Hazardous to Health) Regulation 2000. The procedure Ref. No. ARSE P4-13 2000. The procedure Ref. No: APSB-P4-13 covers chemical storage, chemical handling and chemical spillage.

It was observed that Amfield Plantation's workers less than 40 and under Occupational Safety and Health (Safety and Health Committee) Reg. 1996, less that 40 workers is not compulsory to form the Safety and Health Committee. Nevertheless, there was a safety & health meeting dated 07th March 2024, Ref: APSB-FP6-27.

JKKP8 submission Ref: JKKP8/183048/2023 dated 07th March 2024 recorded no accidents happened at the estate.

Employment conditions
The Good Social Practices Policy Statement was established and signed by managing director on 03rd August 2020. The top management of Amfield Planation Sdn Bhol is committed to implement the equal opportunity within their organization.

The statement states Prohibition of all forms



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of forced labor, child labor, discrimination in occupation, respect of employment and workers balanced provides a work recreational environment and provide freedom of association.

Based on observation and interview session, it was noted that there are no discriminatory practices in the estate.

The payroll and pay slip records of employees showed that all employees are paid with the basic salary are compliance the local minimum requirements. To date, there is no contractor involved in the operation at Amfield Plantation.

Among other social benefits that are provided by the employer to employees are bonus and free housing facilities with water tank for rain water and gen-set. Besides, on-site living quarters are provided to workers. Observed that the living quarters are habitable and have amenities such as are habitable and have amenities such as water, electricity etc.

There is no indication of sexual harassment happening in the estate. Amfield Plantation Sdn Bhd has implemented a Sexual Sdn Bhd has implemented a Sexual Harassment Policy and is committed to creating a work environment that is conducive, safe, and free of sexual harassment harassment.

It was observed that the workers did not join any trade union although Amfield Plantation Sdn Bhd has a Policy - Human Rights Policy, where the management is committed to uphold the right of freedom of association.

As stated in the estate's Policy on No Child Labour, there are no underage workers employed by the estate.

Training and competency
Observed that all employees appropriately trained and Annual Training Programme for the year 2024 was available which includes training on Safety & Health and Environment, Ref: APSB-FP4-20.

OFI No.3; Opportunity For Improvement (Principle 4.4.6.1)

It would be an improvement if the training plan can be more detailed and scheduled accordingly and not only in one month. Therefore, actual training should be done according to schedule instead of just one day for all aspects.

The estate has organised MSPO Awareness and Environmental briefing for its employees on 13/02/2024. Efficiency of energy use and use of renewal energy Based on its Procedure Energy Management, APSB-P5-25, the use of non-renewable energy shall be closely monitored through its Fuel log-sheet and Energy consumption spreadsheet. Solar energy already installed at the estate. Waste management and disposal No workshop at the estate as any repair work for its vehicles & machinery will be outsourced. Estate has developed and implemented its Waste Management Plan as per Identification of waste/pollution and its impact, APSB-P5-18. A relevant Standard Operating Procedure for	Complied.



the Chemical Handling procedure, APSB-P4-13 has been developed on 24th July 2020. The SOP is in line with the regulation under Environment quality management. It include Triple rinse procedure for chemical containers.

The estate has established a proper dumping pit for disposal of domestic wastes in the estate, although it has only few workers.

Reduction of pollution and emission Estate has developed and implemented its Waste Management Plan as per Identification of waste/pollution and its impact, APSB-P5-18. All polluting activities have been identified and massive activities have been identified and measures taken in the continuous improvement on pollution prevention.

Based on Environmental Management Plan, action plans to reduce identified significant pollutants has been established and being implemented in their operational activities.

Natural water resources

APSB has its Water Management Plan,
APSB-P5-25, which includes buffer zone
management, rain water harvesting, sewage & septic tanks and pre-mixing and triple rinsing.

Rain water harvesting practice is applied in this estate. It is also the main source of clean water in the estate. Appropriate action to complement this water source was the provision of collection water tanks by the management.

No construction of bunds, weirs and dams are seen during site visit to the estate.
